On August 28, 1963, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech at the foot of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C. Before him stood a crowd of 250.000 people who had attended the March on Washington for Jobs

speech may be the most famous in Ameri-



can history, but he did not even write it until he arrived at his hotel room and Freedom. King's the night before. In-

deed, he finished his final draft after midnight on the day it was to be delivered. In his speech, King synthesized themes from both the Bible and the U.S. Constitution, but he broke from his written remarks to ad-lib the "I have a dream" section that is so well-known today. It was gospel singer Mahalia Jackson, standing just behind King, who said, "Tell 'em about the 'dream,' Martin." And so he did.

2 8 oz. cans crushed pineapple


